

Electronics Reuse and Recycling Campaign (ERRC)

October 1, 2008 - September 30, 2009

- **What is the ERRC?**

The Electronics Reuse and Recycling Campaign (ERRC) is a competition between Federal agencies to donate, reuse, and/or recycle the most surplus computers and other electronics. It is sponsored by the Office of the Federal Environmental Executive, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and the Federal Electronics Challenge.

- **How does it work?**

It's easy! After a facility is registered, quarterly weight reports of recycled and reused electronics are submitted through the ERRC website by the designated facility representative. Documentation will be requested if a facility is selected as a winner.

- **Who can participate?**

Federal government facilities, including government-owned/contractor-operated (GOCO) facilities. New for 2008-2009 is the Centralized Agency category, which was developed for agencies that have a single centralized reuse/recycling program. Agencies that register as a Centralized Agency will report through one ERRC registration account with one point of contact. The Centralized Agency category is for the headquarters agencies only – sub-agencies and bureaus may not register under this category.

- **Why should my facility participate?**

E.O. 13423, *Strengthening Federal Environmental, Energy, and Transportation Management*, requires all Federal electronics products to be reused, donated, sold, or recycled using environmentally sound management practices at end of life. The ERRC assists Federal facilities with their environmental stewardship responsibility and recognizes Federal leaders.

- **What electronics are acceptable for the Campaign?**

PCs; laptops; printers; monitors; servers; keyboards; mice; VCRs; copiers; camcorders; fax machines; scanners; calculators; typewriters; cell phones; PDAs; telephone systems; speakers; computer cables; power cords; and electronic media.

- **What electronics are NOT acceptable for the Campaign?**

Employee-owned electronics; white good such as refrigerators, air conditioners, stoves, and microwaves; items (such as laboratory or medical equipment) which have not been decontaminated; light bulbs; lead acid batteries; motor vehicles and their components; and hazardous waste.

- **How will the winners be recognized?**

The winners will be recognized at a White House ceremony in December 2009.
