## Why Tanks?

As many of you are aware, the Energy Policy Act of 2005 requires that all facilities with underground storage tanks that have not been inspected since 1998 be inspected by this August and all others within three years after that. Furthermore, recent inspections by EPA Region 2 have revealed concerns regarding the management of not only underground storage tanks at Federal facilities but also above ground tanks. Therefore, EPA Region 2's Federal Facilities Program is hosting this FREE 8 hour refresher on the Federal tank requirements. This FREE workshop will be held on May 2, 2007 at EPA Region 2's Manhattan Office at 290 Broadway. It will on the 30th floor in conference rooms 1-3.

## About the Instructors

Amelia Janisz is president of Green Reviews, a woman-owned small business in New Jersey that has provided consulting services to federal and state clients throughout the United States since 1997.
