The Federal Footprint

- The federal government:
 - Procurements represent roughly 2.7% of USGDP and influence much more
 - Spent ~\$450 billion on goods and services in FY17
 - Spends ~\$90 billion annually on IT equipment and services
 - Spends ~\$3.5 billion annually to provide energy to its facilities
 - Owns/leases ~630,000 vehicles worldwide
 - Manages or owns nearly 1 of every 5 acres in the U.S.



Sec. 2. *Goals for Agencies*. In implementing the policy set forth in section 1 of this order, the head of each agency shall meet the following goals, which are based on statutory requirements, in a cost-effective manner:

(g) Acquire, use, and dispose of products and services, including electronics, in accordance with statutory mandates for purchasing preference, Federal Acquisition Regulation requirements, and other applicable Federal procurement policies



EO13834 – Implementing Instructions – April 2019

- Section III.C.1. Sustainable Acquisition (pg. 28)
 - "Agencies should prioritize products and services that meet more than one of the applicable requirements and are encouraged to procure products and services in a cost-effective manner that advance achievement of energy and environmental performance goals. Agencies may also establish agency-specific standards, policies, programs, and incentives for sustainable acquisition, as long as they meet or exceed the requirements in these Instructions."
 - CEQ has noted that EPA's Recommendations identify private sector standards and ecolabels that help agencies meet more than one of the applicable requirements.
- Section III.C.1. Sustainable Acquisition (pg. 29) & Section III.C.2 Electronics Stewardship (pg. 32): Guidance and Resources
 - "EPA's Sustainable Marketplace: Greener Products and Services website includes EPA's Recommendations of Specifications, Standards, and Ecolabels for Use in Federal Purchasing, which identify products and services that meet statutory purchasing requirements."
- Section III.A.5 Sustainable Building (pg. 18):
 - "Agencies may qualify sustainable buildings, including existing buildings, new construction, and major renovations, using one of the following:
 - 1. The Guiding Principles for Sustainable Federal Buildings and Associated Instructions (Guiding Principles), developed in 2008 and updated in 2016; or
 - 2. Third-party building certifications systems or standards identified by GSA's Office of High Performance Buildings."
 - The Guiding Principles for Sustainable Federal Buildings and Associated Instructions direct agencies to purchase products that meet Federally Recommended Specifications, Standards and Ecolabels (link to EPA's Recommendations) to meet Guiding Principle 5: Reduce the Environmental Impact of Materials.



EPP Program - Areas of Work

Coordinate & Develop	Coordinate and provide EPA technical input for key product sustainability standard development efforts.
Assess & Recommend	Assess and recommend product sustainability standards & ecolabels to be included in EPA's Recommendations.
Technical Assistance	Provide technical assistance to federal agencies to help them procure products and services conformant with the EPA's Recommendations. Provide technical assistance to small businesses to help them sell their products and services to the federal government.
Measure	Measure the economic and environmental benefits of purchasing environmentally preferable products and services.





Measuring the Impacts of EPA's Recommendations

- Exploratory analysis indicates Federal savings between \$3 million to \$16 million annually from time saved by eliminating the need to conduct independent research of appropriate standards and ecolabels
- Estimated use-phase energy savings for all federal EPEAT purchases (one of the ecolabels in our Recommendations) from 2008-2017: \$816 million

Market Research Tools



- GSA's Green Procurement Compilation on the Sustainable Facilities tool (SF Tool).
 - Helps purchasers search for brands and products that comply with federal sustainability requirements.
 - To date, they've successfully integrated product registry data from 14 different EPA Recommended standards or ecolabels
- Others coming soon, but will largely depend on the quality of the standards' or ecolabels' product registry
- Retailers interested in using the same integration technique



EPP Program Authorities

- The Pollution Prevention (P2) Act [42 U.S.C.A. §13103(b)(3) and (10)]: "the Administrator shall..."
 - (3). ...coordinate with appropriate offices to promote source reduction practices in other Federal agencies
 - (10) identify opportunities to use Federal procurement to encourage source reduction
- National Technology Transfer and Advancement Act (NTTAA) & OMB Circular A-119 direct federal
 agencies to:
 - participate in private sector standards development efforts
 - use private sector standards and conformity assessment (e.g., certification) in procurement
- The Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) directs agencies to:
 - [Part 23.703 (b)(1)] "Maximize the utilization of environmentally preferable products and services (based on EPA-issued guidance)."
 - Draft FAR Case 2019-010 may encourage use of EPA's Recommendations to help Agencies meet their
 overall sustainability goals.
 - **EO 13834 and its Implementing Instructions** retain EPP Program's *Recommendations of Specifications, Standards, and Ecolabels* as a resource for federal purchasers, and direct EPA to continually improve upon and update EPA's resources.

Where are the EPP Recommendations being used by Federal family?

Federal Acquisition Service (FAS)

- Incorporated into FAS contracts for furniture, paints, and flooring products
- GSA Advantage and has added a "Meets Recommended Ecolabels" icon to identify green products available through Schedules and Global Supply

Public Buildings Service (PBS)

- Incorporated into government-wide Facilities Standards (P100) and Global Facility Lease document (L-100)
- Using to update Key Sustainable Products (KSP) list

Acquisition Gateway

- Integrated into IT aisles
- Model contract language provided to Facilities/Construction aisle

Sustainable Facilities (SF) Tool

Incorporates all product category Recommendations

Integrated into sustainable acquisition trainings
