FFEO's Role and EPA Enforcement

Federal Facilities Regulation

 Federal facilities are treated the same as all regulated facilities for compliance purposes

Environmental Statutes and Regulations

• EO 12088 (Oct. 1978)

• EO 13834 (May 2018)

Enforcement: FY18 + FY19*

EPA concluded approximately 43 formal enforcement actions, which included:

over \$1.7 million in penalties

 complying actions valued at over \$13.7 million

*These numbers are preliminary as FY19 data has not been finalized



NCI on NPDES

- Again, the same standards apply to Federal facilities as apply to other regulated facilities

Partnerships for Compliance

Partnerships: Authorized Programs

- EPA can authorize a state to be the primary implementer of inspections and enforcement in certain areas
- EPA retains concurrent authority

Partnerships with States

 EPA works closely with states and tribes that are implementing federal environmental programs

 Important: Authorized states are your first-line regulators so it is important that you build relationships and work with them. July 2019: Assistant Administrator's Memo

- Memo: Enhancing Effective
 Partnerships Between the EPA and
 the States in Civil Enforcement and
 Compliance Assurance Work
- Directs OECA to ensure that it communicates effectively with states
- EPA and states work together to:
 - Determine inspections
 - Set priorities
 - Share enforcement responsibilities
 - Reduce duplication of effort and increase efficiency

Environmental Stewardship

Environmental Stewardship

- EPA encourages voluntary compliance in the Federal facility sector whenever possible
- Federal facilities are eligible to receive Audit Policy incentives!
- EPA works with other agencies (including Army Corps-CERL) to support and maintain <u>FedCenter.gov</u>, which has useful resources
- Federal facilities have opportunities to be exemplars of stewardship

Implement waste prevention and recycling measures



Comply with all Federal requirements with regard to solid, hazardous, and toxic waste management and disposal
